
Children in

This term we will be finding out about:

- when World War Two took place and why it started

- the effects of air raids and the Blitz
- air raid shelters
- the causes of evacuation
- what it was like to be an evacuee
- why rationing was necessary and the impact it had
- propaganda posters and the messages they contain
- what happens when light is reflected off surfaces
- patterns that determine the size of shadows
- the functions of different parts of flowering plants
- the requirements of plants for life and growth, and how they vary from plant to plant
- how water is transported within plants




- the part that plants play in the life cycle of flowering plants



School Visits



You could discuss the characters, make predictions and justify these by reference to the text.

PE days: - Tuesdays and Thursdays. Swimming will start in the 2nd half term.




