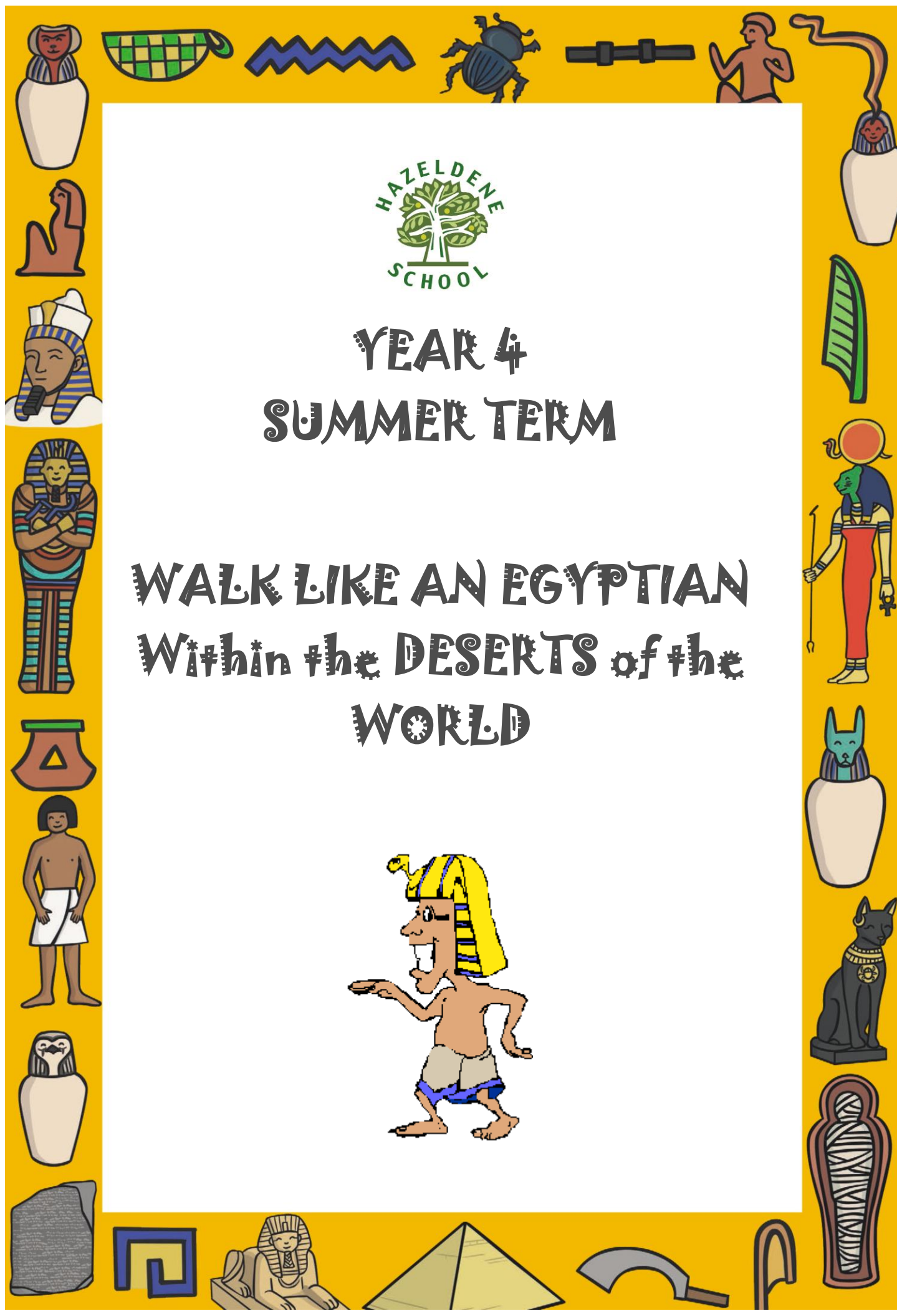




YEAR 4 SUMMER TERM
