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1. Scope

This addendum applies until further notice

Unless covered in this addendum, our normal behaviour policy continues to apply.

We may need to amend or add to this addendum as circumstances or official guidance changes. We will communicate any changes to staff, parents and pupils.

2. Expectations for pupils in school

2.1 New rules

When pupils are in school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below to keep themselves and the rest of the school community safe.

Staff will be familiar with these rules and make sure they are followed consistently.

Parents should also read the rules and ensure that their children follow the new procedures that have been put in place. Parents should contact Helen Ward Headteacher if they think their child might not be able to comply with some or all of the rules, so we can consider alternative arrangements with them.

Basic Principles

Following basic principles can help keep children, teachers, and staff safe at school and help stop the spread of this disease.

- Children, teachers and other staff who are demonstrating Covid 19 symptoms should not come to school and should self-isolate for 14 days
- Staggered times for coming to school and leaving school, staggered playtimes and lunch
- Maximum of 15 children to a class bubble, 2 m apart where possible
- We will enforce regular hand washing with warm water and soap, alcohol rub/hand sanitizer and, at a minimum, daily disinfection and cleaning of school surfaces- see risk assessment
- We will follow Government guidelines for cleaning and decontamination procedures
- We will promote social distancing at ALL times

Amended School Rules for Pupils

- I will protect myself and others, wash my hands frequently, always with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
 - I will remember to not touch my face
 - I will not share cups, eating utensils, food or drinks, resources with my friends
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- I will place used tissues in lidded bin
- I will be a leader in keeping myself, my school, family and community healthy.
- I will model good practices such as sneezing or coughing into my elbow and washing my hands, especially for younger family members
- I won't stigmatize my friends or tease anyone about being sick; remember that the virus doesn't follow geographical boundaries, ethnicities, age or ability or gender.
- I will not spit at or cough at or towards another child/adult
- At lunch time and playtime I will only play with children in my bubble keeping 2m away at all times.
- I will arrive and leave at school at the new times and will ensure I social distance whilst waiting.
- I will follow the one way system around school
- I will tell my parents, another family member, or teacher if I feel sick.

In a situation like this it is normal to feel sad, worried, confused, scared or angry. Know that you are not alone and talk to someone you trust, like your parent or teacher so that you can help keep yourself and your school safe and healthy.

2.2 Rewards and sanctions for following rules

To help encourage pupils to follow the above rules, we will:

Continue to award dojo and house points and praise continually

However, if pupils fail to follow these rules on purpose, we will follow our behaviour step policy (see behaviour policy 2020)

E.g. give verbal warnings, make calls home, red and yellow cards and internal/external exclusions if necessary.

2.3 Changed rules

As long as this addendum applies, we will alter the following school rules.

Expectations for uniform, children are allowed to wear PE clothes, (no football shirts) anything that can be machine washed daily

Unless advised differently by the Government parents will not be penalised if they decide to keep their child and home and continue with home school learning

3. Expectations for pupils at home

3.1 Remote learning rules

If pupils are not in school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below.

Parents should also read the rules and ensure their children follow them. Parents should Helen Ward Head Teacher if they think their child might not be able to comply with some or all of the rules, so we can consider alternative arrangements with them.

- Be contactable during school hours
- Complete online work set by teachers
- Seek help if they need it, from teachers or teaching assistants
- Alert teachers if they're not able to complete work

- Use proper online conduct, such as using appropriate language in messages

3.2 Dealing with problems

If there are any problems with pupils adhering to rules around remote learning, including if they don't engage with the remote learning set for them, we will:

Ring/message the parents to see how we can support the children and family during this really difficult time, we understand the pressure some child and families find themselves in and will always seek to help and support

4. Monitoring arrangements

We will review this policy as guidance from the local authority or Department for Education is updated, and as a minimum every 4 weeks by Helen Ward Head Teacher. At every review, it will be approved by the full governing board.
